As We Gather One of the most well-known of all Advent hymns is “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.” In each of the seven stanzas of this hymn, we plead that our Savior would “come.” Our Gospel reading reminds us that our Savior has come and is literally our Emmanuel, or, “God with us.” At His incarnation in Mary’s womb and birth at Christmas, God was with us. Today, in His Word, God is with us. At His return on the Last Day, God will be with us as our Emmanuel takes us to be with Him.
