

Recently, our Gospel readings have drawn our attention to Jesus, our Good Shepherd. As the Good Shepherd, He will lead His flock to feed on satisfying, green pastures (not on the dead, prickly weeds growing in the wild!). He will lead His flock beside the refreshing, still waters that they may freely drink with no fear of falling into perilous rapids. He is also careful to avoid stagnate waters that might poison His sheep or compromise their vitality. Indeed, even if a life-threatening wolf comes to devour the sheep, with His rod and His staff He will protect His sheep - even to the point of laying down His life for them. In this Good Shepherd we can, truly, rejoice and extol His worthy Name:

The King of love my Shepherd is, Whose goodness faileth never; I nothing lack if I am His And He is mine forever.

Even though our Good Shepherd came first to the House of Israel, we "outsiders" with faith in Him need not fret over our own bloodline. The baptized believer can absolutely assert with all confidence, He *IS* mine forever, for it is the one who has faith in the Good Shepherd that is the true child of Abraham. Abraham is the father of all who *believe* (Romans 411). *Whosoever believes* has eternal life! (Jn 316)

In John10¹⁶, the Good Shepherd, Himself, disclosed to His disciples, "I have sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd."

There you have it! In a war-torn world, weary with hate and suspicion, strife and division, only Jesus can truly create genuine peace and bring true unity - because that unity is centered in Him who is the Good Shepherd, the Lord our God. Foretold by the prophets and claimed by Jesus, Himself. He sheds His own blood for the sheep and creates His own new bloodline in the New Covenant in His Name. The Easter blessing in this is that He can die defending His sheep, and yet in the power of His resurrection still live to protect us evermore! Instead of us being devoured in the end by Death's wolfish appetite, His sheep have in store for them a very blessed end - or should we call it a "neverend," as we will dwell in the house of the Lord, forever!

So, we might as well get used to dwelling in God's house together in the here and now. The "here" is Peace Lutheran Church, and the "now" is 10AM Sundays. One time, one flock, one Divine Service. "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity" (Ps 133). For that unity, Jesus our Chief Shepherd died, rose again and ascended to the right hand of the Father, where He "always lives to make intercession for us" (Heb 725). In John 17, we overhear a few words of our Lord's intercessory prayer for us: "Holy Father, I pray... that they may be one, even as we are one." Wow! In view of such a lofty prayer, St Paul said it best, "Let us make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." (Eph 4³). On this side of heaven, this opportunity won't last forever. So, in this time, in this place, may God grant us a good and pleasant experience - one to be cherished! Amen.

UPDATE YOUR CPR - AED SKILLS - SAVE THE DATE





- * pirate dress-up day / last day pizza party




